

The Carnival Parade on Saturday 28th May proved to be a flamboyant and colourful event winding its way from Victoria Square through Birmingham City Centre down to the Gay Village in Hurst Street, watched by thousands of shoppers. The Positive Mental Health Group ensured that their parade piece - AWAY WITH THE FAIRIES - created interest and excitement.

Birmingham Gay and Lesbian Pride in its ninth year has become the country's biggest FREE gay festival spanning over three days, and raising thousands of pounds for worthy gay and lesbian community groups in the West Midlands. In addition the event brings around £10 million in revenue to the city through visitors who flock to enjoy this great carnival weekend.





Supported by the Birmingham & Solihull Mental Health Trust, NIMHE West Midlands, BGLAD and the Positive Mental Health Group the fairies were certainly "away with themselves". A bright yellow bus was surrounded by colourful "tourists" sporting cameras, lilos, Bermuda shirts and flapping wings!
